### Parking at the Park

The turnaround at the base of the ramp is for boat launching only. Parking is not permitted. Parking is allowed on E. Lake Shore Drive along the fence. Do not block entrances. Please be mindful of our neighbors.

### Reserving the Pavilion

The pavilion is available for all residents in good standing to use. It's a great place to hold an outdoor event such as a Birthday or Graduation. Please note that you can only reserve the pavilion, the park remains open to all SHCC residents. For more info contact Darlene at 815-653-1136.

### VILLAGE OF WONDER LAKE

The Village provides parks, public works, police protection and related services to various subdivisions around Wonder Lake.

- Parking of any vehicle is prohibited on all village streets/roadways between 2:00am and 6:00am daily.

- Parking is prohibited on all village streets/roadways in the event of a two (2) inch snowfall.
- It is prohibited for residents to deposit snow from their driveways onto the roadway.

In addition to these basic rules, all village residents must abide by the Village of Wonder Lake Ordinances. Below are a few to take note of. You can view the entire Ordinance Codebook [here](#)

### Title VII: Traffic Code

**70.27 Unnecessary Noise** – It shall be unlawful to operate a vehicle which makes unusually loud or unnecessary noise.

**72.01 No Parking Places** – At any time, it shall be unlawful to permit any vehicle to stand in any of the following places...

- (D) Within 20 feet of any intersection or crosswalk;
- (E) At any place where the standing of a vehicle will reduce the usable width of the roadway for moving traffic to less than 18 feet
- (G) At any place where the vehicle would block the use of a driveway

### Title IX: General Regulations

**91:03 Duty of Maintenance of Private Property; Abatement** – (A) Duty of maintenance of private property (B) Nuisance

- (1) To deposit anywhere in the village any uncovered piles of refuse...
- (2) To commit or do any act which endangers the public health or safety or which results in annoyance or discomfort to the public;
- (5) To maintain or operate any loudspeaker or amplifier connected with ... device by which sounds are magnified and made heard over any public street or public place;
